

Tools Required

* 9/16", 7/16", 12mm wrench * 9/16", 7/16", 13mm socket, 10mm	*3/4" drill bit * T20, T30 Torx	*Wire cutters or scissors *Pliers
 Make sure the vehicle is parked, on level ground, and the ignition is off. Open the hood and locate the 2x hinge studs on the driver's underside of hood. cut a 2.2" x 0.5" long strip out of the provided EPDM material. Then, place the strip onto each bracket as shown in the image. Try your best to align the EPDM such that the centerline of the tape is about 5/8" down from the top. 	1.	
 3. Place the driver side bracket onto the hood hinge studs. Slide the bracket forward until The EPDM material just barely touches the hood. Place a provided washer over the stud, and then tighten the OEM bolt using a 13mm socket or wrench. 4. Utilize the exploded view below to assemble your light using 9/16" and 7/16" wrenches. Ensure the 9/16" hex head bolt is installed into the universal bracket before the light. Attach the light to the A-pillar mount and tighten. 	3.	<image/>

5. Repeat steps 1-4 for the opposite side of the vehicle.


6. Utilizing a T20 Torx screwdriver, remove the three screws holding down the drivers side floorpanel.






7. Remove drivers side floor panel.


8. Using a T30 Torx, loosen the 4x bolts holding down the battery cover and slide it backwards and up to remove the battery cover.





9. Remove the ground cable from the battery using a 10mm wrench and place to the side.

10. Using a trim removal tool, gently remove the dash panel located up and right of the gas pedal.






11. Using the included wiring harness, route the 2x connectors and switch lead from the battery, into the center console and above the pedals. Make sure the wires do not interfere with the pedal's operation.


12. Locate the wire passthrough on the firewall underneath the dash. With an assistant, feed the 2x connectors through the passthrough and into the engine compartment.






13. Locate a position on the dash to mount the switch. Check behind the dash to ensure there is room to safely drill a $\frac{3}{4}$ " hole. A recommended switch location is boxed in image 13. Once a location is chosen, drill a $\frac{3}{4}$ " hole.

14. Take a photo of the switch wiring then remove the switch wires. Run the switch wires through the hole, plug them into the switch using the reference photo and install the switch into the dash.





15. Run the power cords along the firewall towards the hood hinges. Run the wires around the hood hinges to the lights. Make sure the wires to not pinch or rub on the hinge when opening and closing the hood. For XL lights, plug in the 3-pin 5' extension harness to the passenger side lead. Plug in the connectors to the lights.

16. Using a 13mm and 10mm wrench, connect the positive and negative ring terminals to the positive and negative battery clamps and reconnect the battery.





17. Test your lights then reinstall the battery cover using the T30 Torx. Reinstall the floor panel and floor hold down panel and secure using T20 hardware. Carefully reinstall the trim panel nearest the gas pedal.





For LP Series Backlight Only

A1. Unplug the driver's side headlight connector from the light by pulling the gray tab backwards. Remove the tape covering the headlight wires.

A2. Your DRL wire should be the black/orange striped wire. If your wiring varies, you may also test which is the correct lead by probing each wire with a multimeter when the car is running with headlights off to see which pin gives a DC battery voltage (12 - 14V) and no voltage when the vehicle is off.

A3. Clamp the splice connector onto the DRL wire pin. Run the longer of the two wires to the passenger side of the vehicle following the main harness. Then, replace the headlight connector back into the socket.







*Tie all wires away from sharp, hot, and/or rotating components.

* Re-torque all the fasteners after 100 miles.
